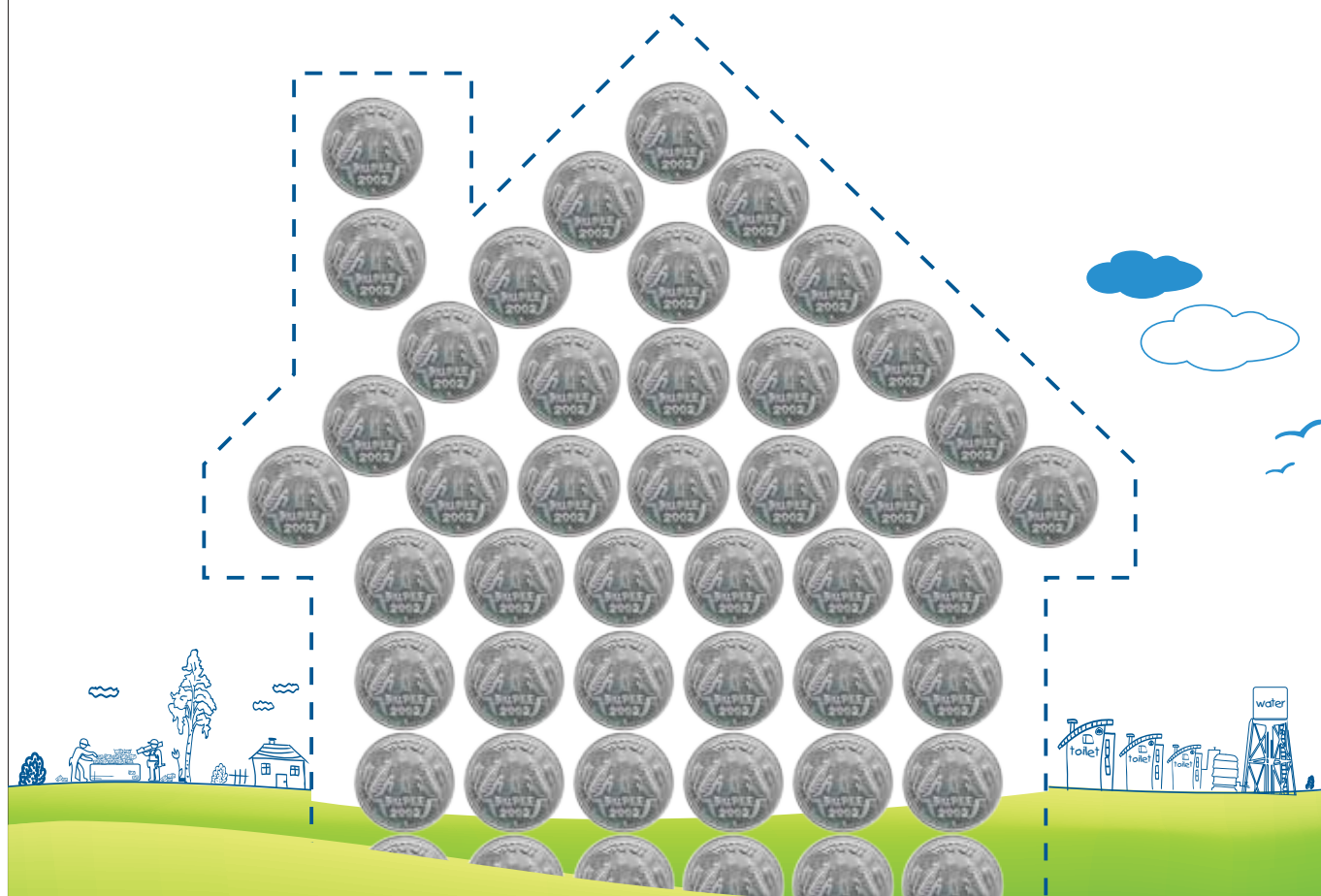

SHELTER ASSISTANCE

We started our mission in India when we helped build homes in Khammam, Andhra Pradesh in 1983. As part of our Shelter Assistance programme, we help urban and rural low-income families build new homes, improve existing ones as well as recover from natural disasters.

Repaired **500** homes in Kerala, Madhya Pradesh & Tamil Nadu

3000 Homes for tribal families in Karjat, Maharashtra.

600 Urban homes for families in Balashwa & Bawana, Delhi.

Helped **13,000** families affected by the Indian Tsunami 2004. (Andhra Pradesh & Tamil Nadu)

During the Uttarakhand floods in 2013 **3,600** families and school children were helped.

Built new homes for **664** families after the Gujarat Earthquake in 2001.

SENSITISE TO SANITISE

S2S campaign works across:

- School Sanitation and Hygiene Education
- Individual Household Latrines
- Community Toilets
- Access to Water
- Behaviour Change Communication

Safe and hygienic sanitation units can bring about a feeling of security, dignity and equality among lower-income families. Through our 'Sensitise to Sanitise' (S2S) campaign, in support of SWACHH BHARAT ABHIYAN, we aim to build 100,000 sanitation units. Providing access to clean drinking water for low-income and rural families is also part of the campaign. We also conduct educational programmes on hygiene and sanitation.

Provided sanitation facilities to **5000** households in Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Punjab, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh & Maharashtra.

Access to safe water to **1700** families in three villages in Tamil Nadu has also been achieved.

Building sanitation units for Schools in Maharashtra, New Delhi & Bangalore

Pinky w/o Raju Kuswaha (Gwalior, MP) was very conscious about her children. In the morning they are supposed to go on the hills which is too polluted and her children are affected by diseases. This affected their education as they were not able to attend school regularly.

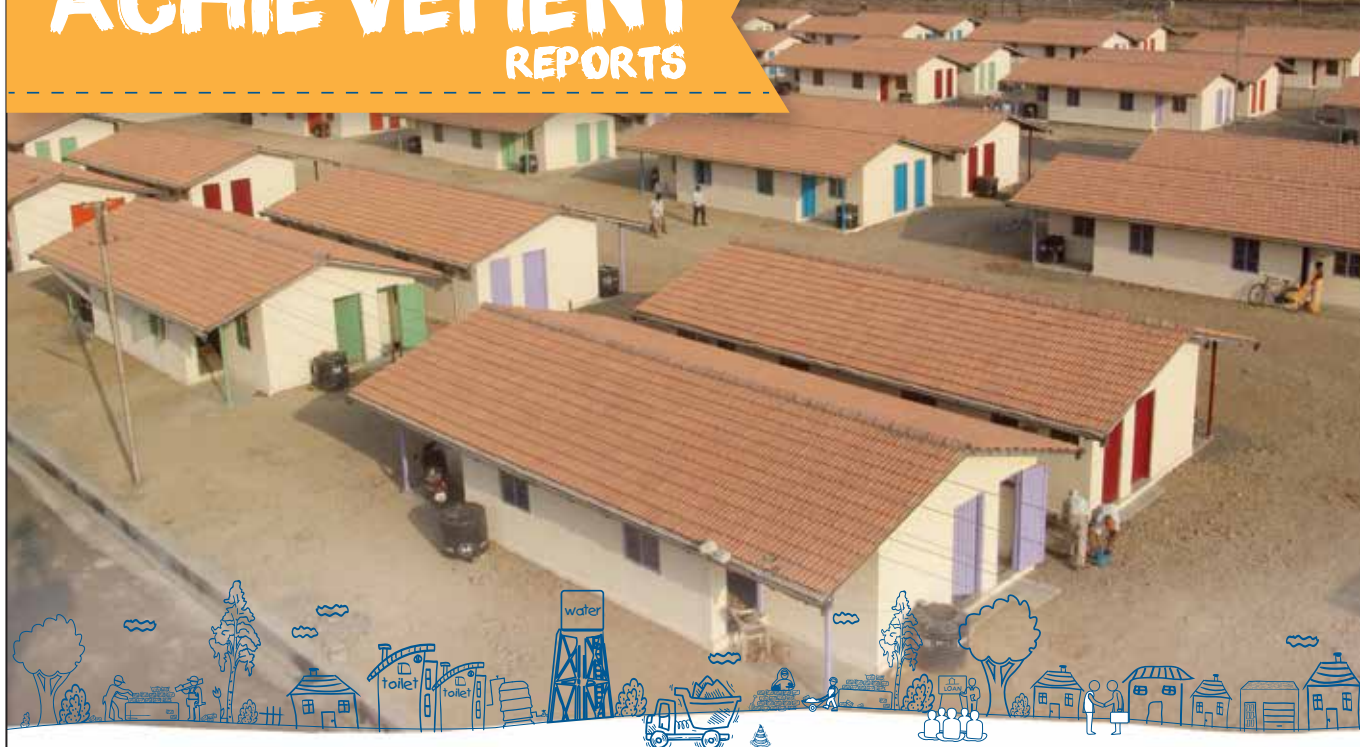

ACHIEVEMENT REPORTS



Habitat for Humanity is thankful to all its donors including schools which helped us in doing the below mentioned projects:-

SHELTER ASSISTANCE

NEW HOME CONSTRUCTION:- PUNE SLUM HOUSING

Habitat for humanity built 300 homes in the year 2014 reaching a total of 2043 homes built for the families living in Nagpur Chawl and Gandhi Nagar slums in Pune till date. The JNNURM, State Government, and Pune Municipal Corporation contributed altogether 90% of the total fund to build the houses for poor in Nagpur Chawl and Gandhi Nagar. A fund support of Rs. 25,000 per house from HFH India was the 10% compulsory contribution by the families to be eligible for the scheme.

Approximately 44 % of Pune's population live in the slums. Majority of the families live in 152 to 250 sq. feet area and most houses have only one room. Women do not have privacy even within their own house and children do not have place to study. These homes do not have proper sanitation facilities which affect their health and the income level is not enough as they work on daily wages.



HOME REPAIRS:

GWALIOR (MADHYA PRADESH)

In Morar and Dabra Block, Gwalior District, Madhya Pradesh the poor families could not repair their roof, floor or walls due to lack of funds. In rainy season water leaks inside the house which spoils their house hold items every year and also live in a fear that the house may collapse because of seepage. Habitat for Humanity intervened to help repair 200 homes in above mentioned districts. Help from Habitat for Humanity assisted them in repairing the walls or roof or floor and have a safe house especially during the rainy season. Some of the houses do not have doors or windows and the help from Habitat for Humanity helped in providing doors and windows and thus lock their valuables and make their houses secure. The thatched roof got repaired to make them safe and permanent and which will protect families from excessive heat in summer, excessive cold in winter and from leakage of rain water.

KERALA

Assistance from Habitat for Humanity enabled 200 low income families in Idukki, Kottayam and Pathanamthitta districts of Kerala to repair their existing houses. The target group consists of marginal farmers, agricultural labourers and low income families. The houses were in very poor condition which required immediate maintenance. The target families, being very poor, were not able to complete the work by themselves without any external support.

COIMBATORE

Habitat Intervention promoted dignified living by facilitating Repair and Home Improvement of 40 vulnerable houses in Pudhupalayam and Narasimanaickenpalayam, Town Panchayat and Kavundampalayam slum located in the Corporation area of Coimbatore, in Coimbatore District, Tamil Nadu. The repair and home improvements included replacement of roof frames and tiles, replacement of doors and windows, repairing of plumbing and electrical works, painting/whitewashing of walls and cementing of broken walls etc., as per the need of each of the 40 families.



DISASTER RESPONSE

J&K Flood Response program.

The 2014 Floods caused immense loss to lives, shelter, livelihoods and infrastructure in Jammu and Kashmir. The State is limping towards normalcy. The adverse weather conditions delayed the recovery operations and most of the flood affected families are staying in public buildings and in their relative's houses during this rough time.

HFH India has planned a two phased response program to assist these families to recover from the loss and work towards rebuilding their lives after the floods. As part of the emergency response plan, HFH India has provided 1020 Humanitarian Aid Kits (HAK) to the affected families. These kits were provided to families in Srinagar, Anantang, Shopian, Pulwama, Poonch, and Udhampur. The Humanitarian Aid kits consisted of Sleeping bags/blankets, a water filter, solar lamp/torch, a bucket, kitchen basic set- plates/spoon and utensils to cook pulses/rice, cooking stove (oil/bio mass type), chlorine tablets, sanitary napkins, toiletries- soap, tooth paste/tooth brushes, and tarpaulin. In the second phase Habitat for Humanity is going to build permanent homes.



SANITATION UNITS:

GWALIOR:-

In Morar and Dabra Block, Gwalior District, Madhya Pradesh, families at present go to far off places to relieve themselves. This is inconvenient, risky and unhealthy. In the target areas, villages and slums are situated in the rocky semi hilly areas and it's a tough task for women especially aged women to climb steep hills in rains and otherwise to relieve themselves. It is sad to know that they remain hungry for days to control their bowels. Sanitation units are important for these families to have a safe, dignified and healthy life. It is also related to privacy and security of women and young girls and children. Habitat for Humanity provide the underprivileged with 200 sanitation units in the above blocks of Morar and Dabra.

SANGLI

Habitat for Humanity supported 500 beneficiary families for construction of toilets. Beneficiaries of this project were not in a position to raise sufficient funds for the construction of toilets. Habitat for Humanity provided them with funds which they needed in addition to funds provided by the Government under Total Sanitation campaign. The beneficiary families supported under Habitat for Humanity India belong to the lower rungs of the society and consisted of backward classes and marginal farmers.

Villages: Malgoan, Nagthane, Kundal, Kavalapur, Vijaynagar, Mhaisal, Arag, Bajrangnagar, Kalambi, Kupwad, Asad, Bhavani Nagar, Devrashtre, Shirate, Palus, Balvadi, Bhoose, Rampur, Ankalkhop, Bambhavade, Kanadwadi, Bhudhgaon and Bedag.



NAMAKKAL (TAMIL NADU)

Habitat for Humanity India implemented a sanitation infrastructure project for 39 poor and marginalized household in six village Panchayats namely, Namakkal, Mohanur, Erumaipatty, Sendhamangalam, Rasipuram and Vennanthur in Namakkal district in the State of Tamil Nadu.
